SUBJECT: URGENT HUMANITARIAN CRISIS: FORMAL complaint Regarding systemic Abuse, Total Medical Neglect, Institutional Discrimination, and severe security failures in Nauru.

Dear Sir/Madam

We are writing this collective formal complaint to condemn the ongoing violations of our fundamental human rights, the total collapse of security, and the sub-human living conditions that we are being forced to endure in Nauru.

We fled our homelands in search of safety, dignity, and the protection of international law. Instead we have been abandoned in an indefinite, lawless limbo. We have repeatedly exhausted all local avenues by informing our case managers and the local DMA, Nauru Government authorities about our suffering but our pleas have been met with absolute indifference, systemic inaction, and a total denial of justice. We are trapped in a system that is causing us severe physical and psychological destruction.

we demand the Australian Government's immediate intervention to halt the following ongoing violations:

Lawlessness Extortion, and severe security failures targeted street violence and Extortion: we are living in constant fear for our lives. Local Nauruan groups routinely corner us on the streets, subjecting us to vile verbal abuse, physical intimidation and forced financial extortion. Refusing or being unable to pay results in immediate aggression and direct threats to our safety. Systemic theft of survival equipment our essential personal belongings including communication devices are regularly stolen, out of sheer desperation and because our bi-weekly allowance forces us into semi starvation our group pooled our last remaining resources to buy fishing nets just to feed ourselves shockingly, our collective survival.

Complete protection failure by Authorities: Every single incident of theft and violent threat has been officially reported to the case managers and local DMA officials. Their absolute refusal to investigate or protect us proves that our insecurity is being deliberately ignored.

Blatant institutional bias and legal discrimination bias in law enforcement: There is a terrifying double standard in Nauru's law enforcement if a refugee is merely accused

of a minor oversight, the local authorities deploy immediate, aggressive and punitive measures against them. Yet when local gauravans openly commit crimes, theft and extortion against us, they enjoy absolute immunity.

Denial of Legal Protection: Because of our status as refugees and asylum seekers, we are treated as secondary citizens who are entirely barred from accessing the equal protection of the law. This institutional bias leaves us completely vulnerable to continuous exploitation and violence.

Weaponized starvation and total medical neglect severe dental crisis and water poisoning. The highly contaminated local water supply is completely toxic to our systems and incompatible with our health. It has caused rapid, agonizing dental decay, relentless toothaches, and internal organ complications like kidney and bladder stones. Furthermore, the unhygienic living conditions have left almost our entire group suffering from chronic, painful skin rashes and itching for years, with zero medical relief.

Complete Absence of Essential Healthcare: There is a total absence of functioning dental or specialized medical care on this island. Many of us are physically unable to chew or eat due to severe unmedicated dental agony forcing us into rapid physical wasting and malnutrition.

Exploitative Electricity Grid and forced food wastage: the power infrastructure is highly unstable. Even when we use our meager allowance to top up our electricity meters, the authorities intentionally delay restoring power infrastructure is highly unstable. Even when we use our meager allowance to top up our electricity meters, the authorities intentionally delay restoring power for hours, engaging in an agonizing half-hour drama while the minimal food we manage to store rots in the refrigerators. This ongoing grid manipulation directly multiplies our hunger and financial devastation.

Conclusion and urgent demands: this is not a fair processing framework. It is a system of slow state-sponsored physical and mental torture. We are living in severe clinical depression, constant trauma, and everyday fear for our lives.

The Australian Government cannot escape its legal and moral accountability for this crisis. We demand immediate, independent protection for local violence and the prosecution of those stealing our survival equipment. Emergency medical and dental interventions to treat our failing health.

An immediate concrete and transparent timeline for our permanent relocation out of Myanmar to a safe country where our lives, health, and legal rights can be guaranteed.
